

Camp Olave Waterfront Rules

1. When you accompany your girls to the waterfront, suitable ratio supervision is expected for the branch level of your girls. Non-swimming girls on the beach are the responsibility of the Guiders.
2. Closed-toed shoes must be worn by all waders and swimmers. A full shoe – no sling backs.
3. Whistle signals:
1 long whistle blasts: an **Emergency**. Get out of the water.
4. One Guider per group will act as Watcher, as defined by Safe Guide.
5. Wading and swimming are permitted only under lifeguard supervision, within the roped-off area.
6. The boathouse is part of the Waterfront Staff's work station, and as such is for her exclusive use, unless you are given permission to access it.
7. Only Waterfront Staff may introduce inflatable toys.
8. Bring the girls' iMIS swimming records to the beach...see Camp Olave Information Sheet.
9. Each camp must bring a first-aid kit to the beach.

Beachfront Etiquette

- Water activity scheduling is often tight. Please arrive at the waterfront 10 minutes before your schedule is to start.
- As a courtesy, let the Waterfront Staff know if you will not be able to keep your commitment.
- Remind your girls to use caution. The beach is rocky and rough, and barnacles and sharp rocks can cut.
- When your swim time is over, organize your group outside the buoy line boundaries on the waterfront, so the next group can access the swim area. Guiders are responsible for the safe return to the campsite of all members of their group.
- There is a shower next to the Friendship Fire for rinse-off after your swim. Please keep it clean, conserve water, and put the hose back properly.

Please arrive at the waterfront 10 minutes before your scheduled swim time.
